### **Court resurfacing**

The paint daubs on court 1 are starting to resemble performance art, and there is a risk they might win the Turner Prize, or become the subject of a preservation order.

Not only that, the cracks are widening, and it's time to wipe the slate clean and start again.

The committee has devoted time this summer to assessing potential contractors, and liaising with other clubs who have recently had courts resurfaced.

As a result of this detailed work, invitations to tender have been sent to three contractors.

The work is to be scheduled for spring 2009.



To help with the cost, we have launched a fundraising campaign. Dee Woods vigorously corralled the committee into composing and submitting an application to the Thomas Flack Trust Fund, which offers funding for projects to benefit residents of Leatherhead, Ashted, Bookham and Fetcham.

Likewise, Kate Ashton discovered that Tesco Charity Trust has made generous grants to the cricket club and other organisations in our area. Kate is masterminding an application for help with resurfacing, plus a smaller contribution towards to cost of nets, balls, etc.
